Collaborative Partnering is a proven method for creating a culture of partnership between the organizations and teams that must work together to achieve the successful delivery of construction project.

This process successfully applied to nearly every delivery method including: design-bid-build, design-build, Integrated Project Delivery, and projects using Lean Construction tools.

Elements of the model include the use of a Professional Neutral Partnering Facilitator, an Integrated Dispute Resolution System, and accountability tools.

When Owner agencies adopt Collaborative Partnering, project teams have an opportunity to deliver projects more consistently on time, on budget, safely, and with high quality.

This presentation will rely on data gathered from new quantitative industry studies and attendees will learn how to improve collaboration on their projects in a consistent and repeatable way.

Rob Reaugh, Principal Speaker is the full-time Executive Director for International Partnering Institute (IPI)

In addition to his work with IPI, Rob Reaugh serves as a Lecturer, a Professional Neutral Partnering Facilitator for construction projects, and as a Mediator in private practice. His expertise is in communication in conflict and working with at-risk populations to deliver mutually agreeable and durable solutions. He has successfully mediated resolutions to more than 80 litigated cases.

Mr. Reaugh received his Bachelor of Science from University of California at Davis in Biological Psychology and a Master's Degree in Alternative Dispute Resolution (MDR) from the Straus Institute for Dispute Resolution at the Pepperdine University School of Law.
